

National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPDR) and State Commission for Protection of Child Rights (SCPCR) in each state will:

Safeguard rights of children



Take necessary steps for free and compulsory education



Monitor a child's right to education



Teachers in school will:

Attend school regularly and observe school timings



Complete entire curriculum within the prescribed time



Properly and carefully assess the capability of each child, as prescribed



Hold regular meetings with parents/guardians to apprise them about the child in terms of:

Regularity in school attendance



Ability to learn

Progress made in learning



Any other information about the child

RIGHT OF EVERY CHILD to Free & Compulsory EDUCATION

"The Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009" provides for free and compulsory education to all children of the age of 6 to 14 years



25% of the seats are reserved for children from economically weaker section, in case of aided schools and unaided schools (except minority-institution run schools), besides such schools that have received land/buildings/equipment/ other facilities either free of cost or at a concessional rate. In such cases, Government reimburses the expenditure incurred on children from weaker sections of the society, as per the limit set by the Government

No school or person can ask for and charge capitation fee and fee for any screening procedure for admission of a child to school



No school or person shall refuse admission of a child to school due to lack of proof of age of a child



It shall be the duty of every parent/guardian to admit the child for elementary education in a nearby school



Government will arrange to provide preschool education for children above 3 years of age and upto the age of 6 years



No child will be held back in any class or expelled from school till completion of elementary education

No child will be subjected to :

Physical punishment



Mental harassment
